

### Harry's Hot Rod Corner

I found this article interested and wished to share it with fellow members. This is part one of a four part series copied from Eckler's LateGreatChevy written by Joe Whitaker. Some very interesting points and facts.

Originally introduced to judge 1955-57 Chevys at early club events, the system has grown to include all 1955-72 passenger cars (including Chevelle, Nova, Corvair, full size, etc. . .), trucks and Corvettes and all Camaros 1967-02. In addition to the 1000 Point Show 'n Shine category, we include a "Cruiser" division, which allows owners to bring and display their cars or trucks and compete for Best Of Show and 10 "Picks", but not go through the stringent judging process. With the input of many Chevy "experts" and members, this system has become what we feel is the best system of its kind anywhere.

How important and credible is our system? Many times when a classic Chevy or Camaro is advertised for sale in Hemmings Motor News or similar classified ads or put up for auction, the owner will state "... scored 985 points and a Platinum certificate at CCI..." in order to certify the car and drive up the price to potential buyers. More importantly, after having a car judged, owners know how their car stacks up to the competition and what improvements, if any, need to be made to score higher. Some are satisfied to reach Bronze or Silver status while others strive for Gold or Platinum. Once a car achieves Platinum (970+ points out of 1000), it is instantly recognized as one of the finest Chevrolets in the world.

Suppose you've decided to enter your car in one of our events. Upon or before arrival, you will be asked if you wish to show your car in either Cruisers or the 1000 point category. Here's how to decide which category to enter:

**Cruisers:** Not ready to show your car, but still want to come and enjoy the event? This category is for you. No real cleanup or strenuous preparation is needed. You may display the car doors open or closed, hood open or closed. . anything goes! A "Best Of Show" vehicle is chosen from the Cruiser category for both Chevy and Camaro. In addition, 10 "Picks" are chosen from all entries. These Picks are not necessarily the best cars in the group, but are often the most unique. Cars in progress and primer are just as likely to win as a shiny showpiece! The Best Of Show and Picks awards are presented along with the Show 'n Shine trophies on awards day. Cruiser winners appear in the magazine coverage along with Show 'n Shine winners.

**1000 Point Show 'n Shine:** This category is for car owners who wish to see how their car really stacks up against a 1000 point judging sheet. A fair amount of preparation is required to do well in Show 'n Shine because you are subjecting your car to perhaps 30-40 minutes of scrutiny by a panel of three participant judges.

#### JR'S HELPFUL HINTS

WD-40 - I received this via email from a friend and thought it was a good topic for us car guys. I added 43 - the washing machine use because it works... Enjoy...

Who Knew...?

I had a neighbor who had bought a new pickup. I got up very early one Sunday morning and saw that someone had spray painted red all around the sides of this beige truck (for some unknown reason). I went over, woke him up, and told him the bad news. He was very upset and was trying to figure out what to do probably nothing until Monday morning, since nothing was open. Another neighbor came out and told him to get his WD-40 and clean it off. It removed the unwanted paint beautifully and did not harm his paint job that was on the truck. I'm impressed! WD-40 who knew?

Water Displacement #40. The product began from a search for a rust preventative solvent and degreaser to protect missile parts. WD-40 was created in 1953 by three technicians at the San Diego Rocket Chemical Company. Its name comes from the project that was to find a "water displacement" compound. They were successful with the fortieth formulation, thus WD-40. The Corvair Company bought it in bulk to protect their atlas missile parts.

Ken East (one of the original founders) says there is nothing in WD-40 that would hurt you. When you read the "shower door" part, try it. It's the first thing that has ever cleaned that spotty shower door. If yours is plastic, it works just as well as glass. It's a miracle! Then try it on your stovetop... Voila! It's now shinier than it's ever been. you'll be amazed.

Here are just some of the uses:

- 1) Protects silver from tarnishing.
- 2) Removes road tar and grime from cars.
- 3) Cleans and lubricates guitar strings.
- 4) Gives floors that 'just-waxed' sheen without making it slippery.
- 5) Keeps flies off cows.
- 6) Restores and cleans chalkboards.
- 7) Removes lipstick stains.
- 8) Loosens stubborn zippers.
- 9) Untangles jewelry chains.
- 10) Removes stains from stainless steel sinks.
- 11) Removes dirt and grime from the barbecue grill.
- 12) Keeps ceramic/terra cotta garden pots from oxidizing.
- 13) Removes tomato stains from clothing.
- 14) Keeps glass shower doors free of water spots.
- 15) Camouflages scratches in ceramic and marble floors.
- 16) Keeps scissors working smoothly.
- 17) Lubricates noisy door hinges on vehicles and doors in homes
- 18) It removes black scuff marks from the kitchen floor! Use WD-40 for those nasty tar and scuff marks on flooring. It doesn't seem to harm the finish and you won't have to scrub nearly as hard to remove them. Just remember to open some windows if you have a lot of marks.

#### TJ'S TECHNICAL TIPS

# Basic Rearend Tech Difference between a "10 bolt" and "12 bolt"



As far as Chevelle rearends are concerned, a 10 bolt rearend has 10 bolts on the differential cover and also on the carrier/ring gear. A 12 bolt, similarly, has 12 bolts on the differential cover and the carrier/ring gear. There are some instances in the B.O.P. (Buick/Olds/Pontiac) and Cadillac world where the number of cover bolts does not match the ring gear bolt count, but since this isn't the Wichita Area Chevelle/Buick/Olds/Pontiac/Cadillac Owners Club, I won't get in to them! In the realm of 64-72 Chevelles, the 10 bolt ring gear measures 8.2" and the 12 bolt ring gear measures 8.875 (8 7/8"). The added diameter allows for the added number of bolts and other areas of optimization. In stock form, 10 bolt rears have 28 spline axles and 12 bolts have 30 spline axles.




Figure 3 – Late spring perch

width. The older generation (64-67) measure 53 ¼" from backing plate to backing plate or 60.0" from drum face to drum face. The newer generation (68-72) are typically acknowledged as 1 ½" wider (i.e. ¾" wider each direction). The other major change is the spring pad on the housing. 1964-1966 had a flat pad on the housing and a plate that bolts/clamps the spring in place (see figure 2). In 1967, GM went to a nipple that locates the spring on the housing end (see figure 3). Since there is no actual retaining device holding your spring to the housing, the only thing that keeps the springs in the car is the fact that the shocks at full extension are still shorter than the free length of your springs. Note that the 1967 housing is one year only since it is narrow like the older housings, but had springs perches like the newer housing.

There are several things that changed year to year. The item of highest importance is

The other notable change in housing configurations is the diameter of the upper bushing. 1964 had a smaller diameter upper bushing in the housing, measuring approximately 1 3/8" where the 1965+ housings had ~ 1 3/8" upper bushings. There is some information out there about the location of the upper bushings, the 1968+ housings had their bushing about 3/8" forward in the housing compared to the older castings. Also note that 1968+ upper control arms are 2.5" shorter than the 64-67 units, but the major contribution to this is frame reconfiguration.

#### Gears and carriers

There are three different "series" of carriers for Chevelle rearends. The difference in carrier from series to series is simply the location of the ring gear mounting flange. If you measure from the ring gear mounting face back to the end of the closer bearing pilot, a 3-series is about 1.800" and the 4 series is about 2.175" (per "BigGearHead" on Chevelles.com). I would assume the 2-series flange would be another 3/8" offset from the 3-series. It is generally known that the following gear ranges apply to the applicable series carriers, however aftermarket gear manufacturers now make gear sets that accommodate the differences from series to series carriers:

#### **Housing ID**

The "quick reference" stuff is described above. Counting the cover bolts and looking at the spring perches can generally get you in the ball park. An even quicker way for to distinguish 10 and 12 bolt housings is if there is just a single bolt at 6 o'clock or 12 o'clock then it's a 10 bolt. If there are evenly "low" or "high" pair of bolts at 6 or 12 o'clock respectively, then it's a 12 bolt (refer to figure 1 for 12-bolt example).

You can dig a little deeper by looking at the date code, which is cast on the rear lower driver's side corner of the center section. The first digit is the Month, but is a letter. So A for January, B for Feb, and so on. The center digit(s) is the day of the month it was cast. The last single digit is the year. In the example below, the date code is K 21 6. So it's a November (11<sup>th</sup> month = K), 21<sup>st</sup> day of November, 1966 casting. Being that it is this late of a housing, it is actually a 1967 model year piece.

Housing part number – On the driver's side, forward/lower corner of the housing, the part number is cast into the center section. The following part numbers are for the listed years:

Some listings will include that N (sometimes NF) after the ID numbers, these simply mean that it is a nodular iron casting, just like the ford 9" centersections with the big N.

#### What's Inside without opening it up?

On the bottom edge of the passenger axle tube there is a series of numbers and letters. These tell you quite a bit about what originally came in your housing. The first two or three letters tell you the gear ratio and whether it was posi or non posi from the factory. The example rearend in the photo below (sorry, not a very good picture) says CW 1129 B.

Since we've determined it's a 1967 housing, we can go to the year specific listing for rearend codes on <a href="https://www.chevelles.com/years/67/67rearcodes">www.chevelles.com/years/67/67rearcodes</a> (lower left corner of Chevelles.com home page) to find that the CW means this housing originally contained a single track carrier and 3.31 gears. I was delighted when I spun one axle and the other turned the same direction indicating that it is a posi. The dates on the carrier indicate that it was '67 original equipment, so it's important to acknowledge that there are things misrepresented on the internet AND/OR that a lot of things came from the factory that weren't necessarily by-the-book. The "11 29" means that the reared was assembled on the 29th day of the 11th month that year, and the "B" means it was assembled in the Buffalo NY plant.

There's a bunch more to rearends than I've captured here, but I figured since I was recently on a rearend adventure that I would scratch some notes out on what I had found and share it with you all.
